Development of a Learning Community to support scholarship and ECDP

What is a Learning Community?

- A group of peers who come together to share their judgements and uncertainties about an area of practice and share ideas or experiences to **collectively support and improve each others progression.**
- A learning community has the potential to bring together motivated staff with a range of experiences and skills to work together for a common goal.

AIMS

- Creation of a learning community

OUTPUTS (SO FAR!)

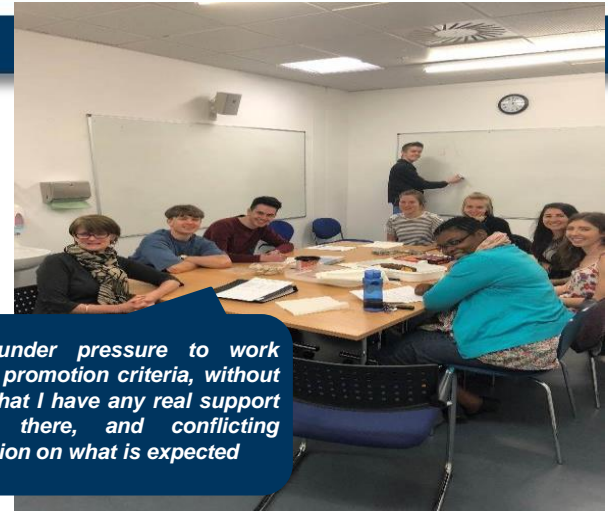
- 7 individual scholarship projects
